GOLF RULES EXPLAINED

There are currently 2 areas of uncertainty regarding the Rules of Golf that is being debated and incorrect decisions being made and I would like to clarify both areas.

1) "When is a ball Out of Bounds?"

If a ball crosses an Out of Bounds (OOB) line and come to rest within an area which is part of the course the ball is not OOB and can be played. Typical examples on our course is a ball being played over the road between the 2nd and 16th holes and coming to rest either on the 16th fairway/green or in the rough of the 16th hole. It had crossed an OOB line to prevent play from the road/properties alongside the 2^{nd} but because it came to rest on a part of the course it can be played. Similarly a ball played form the 10th tee onto the 11th fairway or rough over the houses between the two holes (thereby crossing an OOB line) can be played. On the other hand a ball crossing the OOB line on the left of the 10th hole cannot be played because the driving range is not a part of the course.

Furthermore the OOB line is determined by the nearest inside points at ground level of the stakes used to define OOB. A ball is OOB if all of the ball lies OOB. The stakes are fixed and no relief can be taken from them or from fences outside the OOB line. (See the **Definition of Out of Bounds** in the Rule Book).

2) The second area of uncertainty is the lifting of a ball if it interferes/assist with a player's shot (other than on the Putting Green).

You may

- lift your ball or have any other ball lifted if you think the ball might assist another player, or
- have any ball lifted if it might interfere with your play (physically or mentally) as long as the position is marked, the ball is not cleaned and the ball is replaced in the **exact spot** from where it was lifted. This can take place anywhere on the course. However if a ball is lifted because you think it might interfere with another player's shot and you were not asked to do so you will incur a penalty of 2 strokes (Rule 22)



PLEASE JOIN THE RECYCLE DRIVE

We want to urge members to use the two new green recycle bins in order to reduce the amount of rubbish lying around due to overfilled rubbish bins. They have been strategically placed at the first tee and also next to the putting green (where all the carts pass by and/or stop). FROM THE CAPTAIN

CHANGES TO THE HANDICAPPING SYSTEM

The South African Golf Association (SAGA) and Women's Golf South Africa (WGSA) have recently decided to follow international trends and make the following changes to the South African Handicap system and manual.

1. With effect from 1st April 2016 handicaps will be calculated overnight and any adjustment will be effective as of the next day.

With all scores now captured electronically the system is able to immediately calculate a golfer's current handicap - a process adopted by the majority of golf playing countries and in line with proposals for the World Handicap System planned for introduction in 2018.

2. With effect from 1st April there is also a change to the score entry for golfers who do not finish their rounds. Where a player has completed 7 or more but less than 14 holes, the score should be recorded as a 9 hole adjusted gross score. When 14 or more holes have been completed, the player should record an 18 hole adjusted gross score. For unfinished holes required to complete a 9 hole or 18 hole card, golfers need to record a score of par for the hole plus any handicap strokes for that hole, as detailed on the course score card.

NO RETURNS

We have received some complaints about players not entering their scores but entering a 'no-return' instead. It may have gone unnoticed in the past but will be monitored closely in future. The only time when a player is allowed to enter a no-return is:

- When the player leaves the course due to weather, medical emergency, etc., in which case the rule as explained in paragraph 2 (above) applies
- When a player plays alone.
